Did you know the national minimum wage has been increased to Ghs 11.82/ a day ?

How do you think this affects employment? The National Tripartite Committee (NTC) has announced an increase in the National Minimum Wage to Ghs11.82, which is an 11% increase over the Ghs10.65 figure for 2019. This new change will take effect from **January 1**, 2020. This is the least wage any employer can pay a worker in a day in Ghana. Also the NTC had agreed that the new NDMW should be tax-exempt.
