Supply food items and provisions for our nutrition program

Items such as rice, tin tomatoes, cooking oil and pasta are staples used weekly in our kitchen.

- 2 bags of 50kg Rice a week = GHC 500.00
- 25 kg of Oil a month = GHC 300.00
- 1 box of Pasta a week = GHC 45.00
- 1 box of tin tomatoes /month= GHC 120.00
- Toilet Tissue = GHC 100/month
- Protein (Chicken/fish) /week = GH600.OO

Supply clean drinking/cooking water for our nutrition program

Providing a hot cooked meal a day (6 days a week) for our children, requires we have clean drinking and cooking water. On an average, we use 20 bags/ a week @GH4.00 a bag.

- Sponsor a month supply @ Ghc 320.00


