Children celebrates Valentine's Day



A double win for the boys at the Rapid Chess tourney

Mentors Chess Academy in collaboration with the Ghana Chess Association, organised Tournament on February 24, at the Association International School. Six players from B.A.S.I.C.S took part in the Under 14 and U18 division. B.A.S.I.C.S had 3 wins out of a possible 6 for the final round. Jeffery, Jeremiah and Vincent won this round. In all, Jeffery with 4.5 points out of 5 placed 1st for the U14 division. Jeremiah came 3rd with 4 points. For placing first, Jeffery was presented with a gold medal, a big chess board and a certificate. Jeremiah received a bronze medal, a chess board and a certificate for placing third. The other 4 players had certificates of participation.

In December, 2019, four of our girls participated in a chess qualification match to determine who represents Ghana in Russia 2020. Out of the four, two girls qualified to the next stage where they will meet with the best players in Ghana to compete for a spot in the Ghana team. Rebecca Barnor and Mary Barnor are the two girls who advanced to the final stage of the qualifiers. With the qualifiers more than a month away, and to ensure these girls were well equipped and practiced each day, B.A.S.I.C.S gave out two Amazon Fire Kindles loaded with chess materials, strategies, and chess simulation games for the girls to use at home. We had some volunteers who passed by each Sunday to teach them some chess strategies and moves.

The Barnor sisters participated in a three (3) days chess qualification match from February 21. This was one of the toughest competitions for the girls as they had to play against some of their chess teachers and other chess officials to qualify for Russia. As usual, our mother and founder was present to offer some emotional support as the girls felt discouraged over every game they Though they were unable to qualify, they still made some good impression by winning a few games.

We celebrate and cherish Horace and every single donor who provides us the support we need to ensure the sustenance of our programs. We say Ayekoo and God bless you.








Football Beyond Borders: Changing the lives of young people through football

Center shutdown as COVID-19 cases increase in Ghana

On March 19, 2020, B.A.S.I.C.S had to close it's center to allow children and staff to stay home and help stop the spread of Covid 19 virus. On Monday March 16, the President of Ghana announced the closure of schools and other institutions as the number of infected cases increased rapidly. Children were left to go home unprepared with no learning materials from the schools as the announcement came on Sunday evening. It became our priority to ensure children are well prepared to study at home should our center be closed.

With very little notice, Staff and interns worked hard to prepare learning materials for each year group; word puzzles, review questions, worksheets, reading books, etc were among some items given to children when we had to finally shut down. Additionally, kids were given school supplies, toiletries, sanitary napkins and a few food items to use at home. It's not enough to educate just yourself, educate others around you as well. Our center is officially closed for staff and children, however our center is open to children who would like to work independently and may not get the luxury of doing so in their homes. We have opened a Trust Library stocked with reading books for all age groups; this is to help children improve upon their reading and vocabulary. Strict sanitation methods hav

In our quest to stop the spread of Covid-19 and other diseases, B.A.S.I.C.S International provided and continues to provide FREE cleanwater to people living in chorkor. For the past 5 months, there has been a shortage of water in the community. People have to queue at dawn to buy water from homes with running taps and pay. At a time when many are left with no income as there is a forced quarantine in most countries, communities like Chorkor suffer more.. This initiative is to ensure people have water at home, and are able to wash their hands as often as possible to avoid spreading diseases. Water is essential; for bathing, washing hands, washing clothes, drinking, cooking, and watering plants. But many don't have that LUXURY. It is our vision to see to it that people in Chorkor get to enjoy this luxury.


