# Children served breakfast and lunch during COVID-19



Since March 16th, when schools closed, school lunches ended also; and children were left hungry. Under the B.A.S.I.C.S sponsorship program, we ensure every child receives 2 meals a day, through paying for school lunch and providing dinner after school. However when all social gatherings including schools were ordered to seize, families struggled to fill the gap, that they never had to think about. B.A.S.I.C.S quickly responded by running shifts to feed children at least one meal and also provide weekend food boxes, but still it wasn't enough.




Children need nutritious meals and vitamins to grow healthy, and fight Covid. We serve breakfast to children everyday, as it is an essential meal for everyone. Children report to the center early, and take a hot breakfast drink and sandwich/fruit to start their day. For those reporting to the center later in the day, we add fruits and Sobolo drinks (Hibiscus tea) to help boost their immune system.

# NO COMMUNITY LEFT BEHIND

With help and assistance from individuals and the international community, we are able to supply food items and clean drinking water to senior citizens and children in the Chorkor community. At the beginning of each week, our team prepares food bags by sorting and packaging them for delivery.







On the day of delivery which is Wednesday/Thursday, our Covid-19 relief aid team sets out into the community in teams of two to deliver packages on a truck.







Our focus on food packages is mainly senior citizens and children; these are grandparents with no source of income and mostly depend on others for their daily meals. Most of them also have grandchildren living with them, and they are responsible for their daily upkeep as well. Our gesture of giving is to support them during these trying times. Every Thursday, our children also go home with their weekend food packages and bags of clean drinking water. This is to support and relieve some financial strains on parents during weekends.







### How we became essential workers

When the pandemic hit Ghana, and things shut down, the 5 ladies of Hedzole (our social enterprise) started making face masks to distribute to our children, staff and community members. But the reality hit, and they realised they were also unemployed because, there were no bazaars or hotels to sell their quilted bags, runners or bedspreads.





The ladies decided they would join forces with one of the largest apparel companies in Ghana, Cadling Fashions and work on the line to make masks. Cadling Fashions had just earned a government contract to make 750,000 masks, and other PPE for Ghana; so there was plenty of work to do. The ladies who have been in charge of their own production, selling, sourcing and marketing, were now line workers. They worked alongside 200 other people who also had their own stories but they shared one mission now and that was to MASK GHANA.







The owner of Cadling Fashions; Mrs Linda Ampah set an example each day, and reminded the workers of the important role they were playing as 'essential workers". Moved by the commitment and the mission; our own Executive Director " Aunty Pat", joined the line as a volunteer and helped at the factory'- helping with quality control, packing, record keeping production.





The ladies continue to work at the factory, which earns them an income during a time, when so many are out of work. We thank you Cadling Fashions.



Promise CAMP/CAMP PROMISE will expose children to skills and opportunities that might not be easily found in urban communities, and empower them to develop their individual potential. Situated on 8 acres of land 95 km out of Accra, on a beautiful nestled farmland 15 km from the Shai Hill Game and 45 km from Akosombo Dam.

Children will come together to create memories that will last a lifetime. Every holiday at CAMP PROMISE is filled with fun, friendships, learning and excitement. Our campers will develop and improve skills through high-level instruction, and will be encouraged to try new things while learning about others and themselves. Campers enjoy every moment of vacation camp while they grow in confidence, leadership and self-esteem in a secure, community environment.

Camp Promise is in need of your help to ensure we complete construction, implementation and OPEN for the children by 2021. Our original date was August 2020, however due to Covid 19, our major fundraiser was cancelled; which halted the process.
